

- Visitation to nursing homes, women and children's centers and homeless shelter for both men and women.


- o Philadelphia District churches supporting Overseas Missions and its projects.

- Visit a "Batey" located 3 hours away from the city where the majority of the community are from Haiti. There, we were able to provide a hot oatmeal for more

than 200 children . Rev. More and Dr. Franco were able to teach Sa bible lesson to them.




